The bridal couple will visit relatives of the bride in Georgia and Alabama before returning here to reside. Mrs. King and her mother and brother will return the latter part of the week.

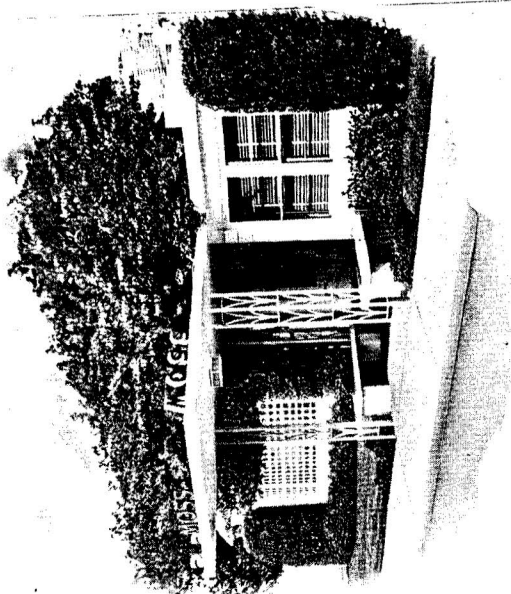

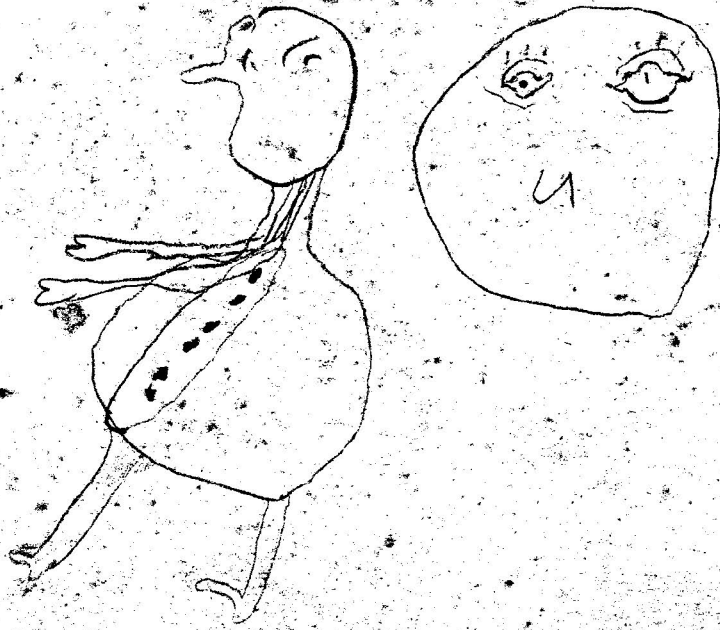
