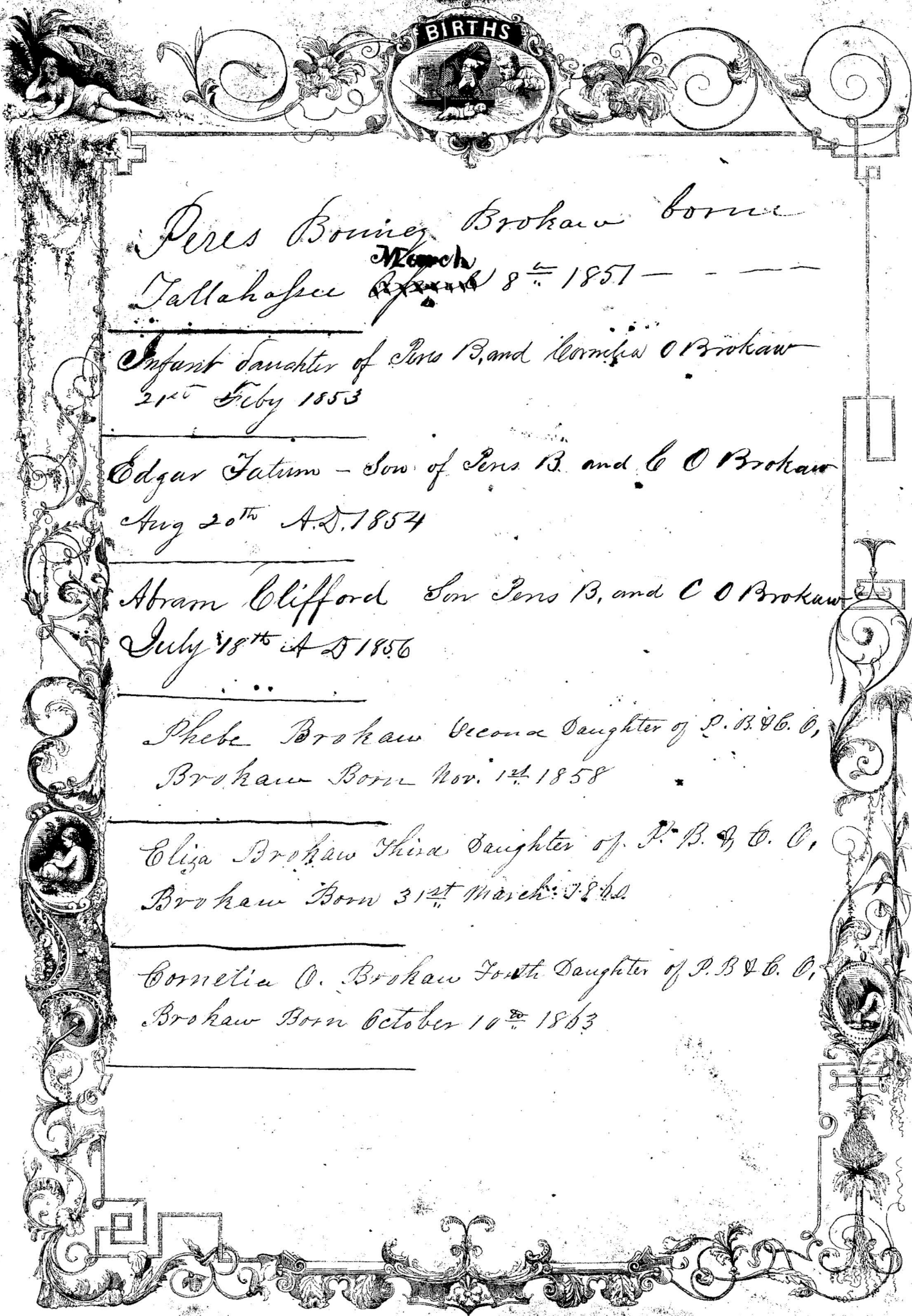

Another Good Citizen Gone.

Tallahassee has lost another of her old and estimable citizens. Captain Peter B. Brokaw died at his residence in this city on Tuesday last, 27th ult. and was buried from the Presbyterian Church on Wednesday afternoon.

Captain Brokaw was in his sixty-second year. He was born in Bound Brook, New Jersey, and came to Tallahassee from Alabama in 1840, and engaged in the livery business in a large wooden building on the same lot where the brick stable now stands, and which business he pursued, combined with planting, up to the time of his death. About twenty years ago he attached himself to the Presbyterian Church and subsequently became a Ruling-Elder in that denomination. In 1856 he was elected to the House of Representatives from this county, running ahead of his ticket, and in 1860 he was chosen to the State Senate.

Early in the war which followed, he raised and commanded a company of calvary, but resigned before the close of the strife. In 1872 he was made Chairman of the State Executive Committee, and remained as such to the day of his decease. In all these positions he served with great usefulness.

Few men in this community will be more generally missed than him to whose memory these few feeble lines are a tribute. His church and society will feel and mourn his loss, and his family, to which he was devoted, with surpassing affection, are bereaved beyond expression, and the community mingles its tears with their's in this their great affliction. He was a benefactor to the poor, and no enterprise, either of charity or otherwise, ever failed to enlist his sympathy and ardent support. Calm in judgment, firm in his opinions, he was at the same time too modest and retiring in character to obtrude himself unbidden, but when approached was never backward in his advice and assistance. His house was the abode of the largest and most elegant hospitality, and none ever visited his pleasant home without being impressed with the largeness of heart of its head, and the peace and quietness which resided under that hospitable roof. "Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord." The peacefulness of his death most happily illustrated "how a christian can die." Conscious of his end, he calmly took leave of his heart-broken family, one by one, and then quietly awaited his Master's call, the only calm one in the solemn group of distressed friends who surrounded his dying couch.

Thus has passed away from our midst a devoted husband and father, a faithful christian, an estimable member of society, and a true and earnest lover of all that was good and noble, whose heart was open as melting charity, and whose deeds will follow him.
