History of the Bible: In 1997 the bible was in the possession of Jane Reynolds Harris and John Flanigan Harris, of Tallahassee, FL. John F. Harris is the step great-grandson of Edna Love Caldwell and great-grandson of her husband. The bible belonged to Edna Love Caldwell, second wife of Leroy Campbell Caldwell of Statesville NC. A few later entries were made by Margaret Flanigan Harris, mother of John Flanigan Harris, who was raised by the Caldwell family for a number of years. "Miss Edna" was a school teacher who once taught the Rev. Billy Graham in Charlotte NC.

Joe Yongue Caldwell was born in Statesville NC, Oct 19, 1892, and died in the place of his birth, Dec 24, 1919, age 27 years.

He is the son of L. C. and Maggie Yongue Caldwell.

Two years ago he went to Denver. While there he accepted an appointment to a R. R. position – inspector of fruit trains out of California East Bound. Faithfully he did the duties of the responsible place, and as they took him into the open he was growing into robuster strength until stricken down by the westward sweep of influenza. He never recovered. In November his father and mother went across the continent and brought him home. But that home with all of its companionships and comforts and ministries and prayers could not retain the gentle spirit, but in the awakening Christmas season young Joe Caldwell went home to be with God.

In the autumn of 1909 he entered the University of North Carolina. He was graduated June 4, 1913. He read law at Columbia University, New York City, finishing at Chapel Hill. In 1915 he formed a partnership with his father under the name of Caldwell & Caldwell. Always dignified, poised and thoughtful, a pointed and incisive speaker, thus well equipped, a future all brilliant was entered upon. But now he is gone! Like the Savior cut off in the midst of his days. How is the strong staff broken and the beautiful rod! God knows best.

Five times he offered himself to his country when the great world war came on. In the Army, in the Navy, as officer, as private, seeking somewhere to be accepted. Five times he was disappointed, not physically able to bear the stress of service.

His life was white and Christly, free from those vices that too often affect youth. As he neared the end he said to those about him that through his life he had tried never to go any place he could not take his mother with him. Priceless heritage, a testimony like that, helping in your grief! Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God.

The Bible his mother gave him sixteen years ago he took with him to the West. Out there from day to day he found in it those things of the Spirit, that through faith and prayer he sought that he might find. He was glad to talk of the comforts he always found in the Scriptures—the fellowship with God. His prayer life was mature and saintly. He took God at His word, committed his way unto Him and had definite and striking answers to prayers.

Unafraid he waited the hour of his passing. On Dec 24th while the angels were singing of the “Unspeakable Gift”, of Him who so loved the world that gave His only begotten Son, the soul of Joe Yongue Caldwell made clean in his Saviour’s blood, passed through the gates into the city of God. J. H. P.
